

TRUTH BEHIND THE BMC PIPELINES Running through Doongerwadi since 1918

Most in our community are not aware that BMC water pipes have been running through the Doongerwadi property for over a century, since 1918 to be exact. If one was to walk past the lower bungli, past the side gate till the end of our property where the stairs lead down to Khareghat Colony, you will see a 600mm pipe coming out of the wall and going underground. Below that is another 750mm pipe. The 750mm pipeline leaves our property just before the side gate and the 600mm pipeline leaves our property after the now demolished lower Bungli pavilion.

This is an addition to the large overhead water pipe we see in that same area which was made in 1987-88 as stand-by.

What we need to realize is that these pipes are over a 100 year old and have run their life. They have never been repaired or maintained. They need to be urgently replaced. The landslide last year happened right in front of the Doongerwadi side gate below which the hill gave way. God forbid if the pipes had burst higher up, towards the Spenta bldg, then the land slide would have not only affected the foundation of the Spenta Building but also the Khareghat Colony buildings situated at the top of the hill.

Given the large diameter of these pipes, they cannot be taken below the road until after Spenta bldg because the road leading down is built over arches whose depth is very narrow. That is why Mr. Baig has requested the BMC to provide us with a solution in which the BMC Water pipes exit the Doongerwadi property right after the arches end. We await the new BMC schematic to discuss and decide in the Board.

ANOTHER ATTEMPT BY KERSI RANDERIA TO DIVIDE OUR COMMUNITY WITH HIS LIES!

Dear Community Members,

Friday evening a malicious and fabricated whatsapp message was circulated against me by Trustee Kersi Randeria who is once again trying to create disharmony within the community on a non-issue. Despite knowing the facts of the meeting held at the Doongerwadi, he has lied to the community to create hurt and hatred amongst us.

Everyone is aware that Mr. Randeria is under investigation by the authorities for financial misappropriation for a slum rehab project. But it doesn't end there. Lately I have been exposing various other financial discrepancies at the BPP committed by Mr. Randeria's during his first few years as a Trustee. This is probably why he is now fabricating stories to take the spot light away from himself.

Mr. Randeria tries to predujice the community against my family because of the good offices we share with the BMC D Ward. My family have been Corporators of the D Ward continuously for 47 years. My grandfather Rusi Mehta served five terms, my youngest Kaka Noshir Mehta served three terms and my Fui Anahita Mehta served two terms. So evidently we share a good and cordial relation with them.

What Mr. Randeria will not tell you is the number of times, at our Board meetings of which he has been a part of, I have been asked to use these same good offices to help the BPP in various matters. In fact just a few weeks ago the Board asked me to speak with the D ward municipal commissioner and report back in regards to proposed Skywalk at Malabar Hill as well as the soil solidification of the hill behind Building 5 at Khareghat colony adjoining the newly constructed wall.

When the BMC water-pipe burst last August, I was the only Trustee that stayed on site that day. I personally called up each of my colleagues and got their approval to allow the BMC to lay the temporary water pipes through our property given the civic emergency. I visited the site almost daily to ensure that all our conditions were met. So naturally the BMC made me their point of contact in this regard. Hence when the BMC had a presentation ready for removal of these temporary pipes, they contacted me and asked me to share it with the Board, which I did on Monday July 5. Unfortunately this seems to have bruised the ego of Mr. Randeria who has making false allegation on me and my family ever since.

At our Board meeting on Tuesday, July 6, we discussed a presentation sent by the BMC. During our discussions I requested the Board to make a site visit along with the BMC Water Dept team so we can understand the situation and their proposal better. Mr. Randeria refused to attend and insisted that the BPP Projects Dept Head Mr. Bilal Baig visit the site first along with the BMC team and then send a report to the Board to be analysed.

On Thursday evening, July 8, I spoke with the BMC Water Dept representative and set up a meeting for 430pm on Friday July 9 with his team as well as our BPP Project Dept Head Mr. Baig along with his Deputy Mr. Khushru Bharucha. In attendance from the BMC D ward were Asst. Engineer Mr. Bagwe, Asst Engineer Hydraulic Engineering and Construction Division Mr. Phaphale, Sub Engineer Hydraulic Engineering and Construction Division Mr. Khode and Mr. Sayyad, OSD D ward among others.

At the meeting with the BMC, Mr. Baig raised some queries and made some suggestions and asked the BMC team to prepare a detailed schematic so that he can present it before the Board. Post that it was suggested that the entire Board of Trustees make a site visit to understand the details better. The meeting ended here and we await for the BMC to revert to Mr. Baig with a fresh plan so that he can make a representation of facts to the Board. Constructive dialogue was held and no decision on any kind was taken at this meeting. It was repeatedly made very clear to the BMC that the final decision would be made by the entire Board of Trustees after taking into consideration all the facts and no one Trustee could take that decision.

Ironically Mr. Randeria spoke to Mr. Baig before Friday's meeting with the BMC. He knew what the meeting was about. Yet he chose to lie to the community. More so he deliberately tried to mislead the readers by mentioning that I was present with some BPP staff when he was fully aware that the BPP Project Dept Head Mr. Baig was present to meet the BMC team.



If any of you have any doubts or queries please feel free to call. I will be more than happy to clear any misconceptions you may have. If you'd like to do a site visit and see for yourself, we can do that too.

As you can read from the above, this entire episode has been blown out of proportion by Mr. Randeria. This is another instance where (to create hatred within the community), Mr. Randeria has lied and mislead the community – just for political mileage!

My father is above 75 years old but as the ex-Chairman of the BPP and a Trustee for 21 years he is still passionate about our community. Last year when the land slide happened, despite it being peak Covid time, he kept visiting the Doongerwadi and Khareghat Colony to ensure the BMC was doing their job right, ignoring our concern for his health.

Despite such dedication to our community, Mr. Randeria refuses to drop his angst against my father. In his battle to settle scores with my father Mr. Randeria is dragging the BPP down with him. He has become a deterrent to anything constructive the BPP wants to do and lately has taken to social media and his newspaper to constantly misrepresent facts and create biases and divide amongst us (like he tried to do against Dr. Zuleikha Homavazir when he admitted to us that he had leaked the BPP minutes to prejudice voters against her).

I have been a trustee for over five years. During the course of my term Mr. Randeria has wished my father dead in front of the entire Board, imitated and mocked my mother at a Board meeting, beaten my brother, mocked the legacy of my late grand-father and much more. He has even threatened to go after my job. Mr. Randeria constantly tries to create controversy where there is none just for one-upmanship.

Despite all this I keep requesting him and the Board to work together harmoniously towards a brighter and more prosperous future, not just for the BPP but for the entire community. I am willing to take the first step in the right direction, I just hope he is too.

FACTS

BMC Water Pipes:

Permission to the BMC to lay temporary water pipes was given unanimously by the entire Board of Trustees (including Kersi Randeria). He even came one day to look into the work that was going on.

Drones:

Permission to allow drone survey of the land-slide area was given by 4 out of 5 Trustees. In fact Mr. Dastur was present on site and I was personally standing behind the drone operator to ensure that only the land slide area was recorded. A copy of the recording is with the BPP.

- Funnily enough in January 2021, Mr. Randeria, who opposed the drone survey of the landslide area, willingly agreed to allow helicopters to fly around the Doongerwadi at low altitudes during heavy monsoon and emergencies. This admission was made at our meeting at Mantralaya before the Chief Secretary of Maharashtra as well as Sq Leader Minoo Wadia, Trustee Noshir Dadrawala and myself.

- Full disclosure: a few days after the drone survey, Mr. Dadrawala withdrew his consent probably under pressure from Mr. Randeria.

Parsi Gate:

Late last year, I was able to arrange a meeting with Cabinet Minister of Tourism and Environment for the Government of Maharashtra, Mr. Aditya Thackeray in regards to the Parsi Gate. I was accompanied by BPP Trustee Xerxes Dastur as well as Ms. Havovi Sukhadwala. Mr. Thackeray was emphatic to our plea but told us there was not much he would be able to do as work had already begun. But he offered us solutions to re-locate the Parsi Gate at the new promenade as close to the original position as possible. This was not acceptable to many a few community activists continued their efforts knocking on various other ministerial doors to try and re-align the coastal road but to no avail. Ultimately we ran out of time and the BMC have removed the Parsi Gate. Efforts are on to ensure the proposal given by Mr. Thackeray fructifies.

Just five years back Muncherji had financed the full Construction cost of the Prayer Hall at BMC's Worli crematorium through his A. H. Wadia Trust of which he was a Trustee. And as pre-ordained, Munchi was consigned to the Worli crematorium. But due to his massive weight of over Kg 300 it was not possible to take him into the electric crematorium and hence he was taken to the wooden pyre to be cremated there. All his household staff of over 8 were there in full attendance helping to put him in the pyre and then the wood all around his body. They really missed their master and were bawling away. A real loyal breed of servants full of praise for their master, who looked after them well during his life time.

He had a wonderful sense of humor though more on the sarcastic side and I used to love seeing his winking when he was having it out with someone. Usually Khojeste Mirty was the butt of his many jokes especially when he would offer papers to him and make him stretch further and further with his trembling hands.

Munchi also donated two brand new Hearses to Doongerwadi to ferry dead bodies from their residence to Doongerwadi.

He was badly treated by his colleagues on the BPP Board when Yazdi Desai in revenge for having defeated his wife Anahita Desai filed a false Change Report Ultimately justice prevailed and the Charity Commissioner ruled in his favor in March 2018 and the Change Report was dismissed and his Trusteeship was continued but his term then came to an end in July 2018. Thus out of his seven year term he could serve as a Trustee of BPP for just around four years. During the three years that the hearing of the Change Report lasted it was Anahita Desai who attended everyone of his hearing and kept on delaying the matter so that he could not function as a Trustee.

Japanese blood in him as he so resembled the Mikado, as he sat majestically (sometimes wearing his little Parsi Topee) on the centre of the stage of the K R Cama Auditorium, on a chair (or should I say throne) specially designed to take his considerable weight. He was amazingly knowledgeable on history, religion, culture and languages and was a voracious reader. He often astonished me with snippets from history and told me things that I was totally unaware of. His loss will leave a large vacuum in the K R Cama Oriental Institute that will be difficult to fill.

He had a very strong sense of what is right and what is wrong and was bold enough to say so openly. Our views coincided on many issues and we often bemoaned the lack of morality we see around us today.

He had a delightful sense of humour and I used to love seeing the mischievous twinkle in his eye when he was having a dig at something or someone. When I wrote to him about the passing of a common friend in June last year, he responded by saying "and your pal survives to torture humanity" and added "(sent with Gentle Effect)" as did many of his messages to me. That was Munchi!

I knew him only since the last few years - about 9 or 10 years.

"Nauzer Bharucha on Munchi Cama

Two days after Asia's oldest newspaper, the Gujarati daily Mumbai Samachar entered its 200th year, one of its owners, Muncherji (Munchi) Cama, passed away on Saturday. The paper was founded on July 1, 1822, but the Cama family became owners in 1933.

Besides being a newspaper proprietor, not many know that Munchi also controlled the Ardeshir Hormusji Wadia Trust, which according to government records, is one of the biggest private landowners in Mumbai. It has over 361 acres in Kurla and a corpus believed to be a humungous Rs 700 crore. Some years ago, when I asked him about the trust's phenomenal land holdings, he explained to me: ``We cannot speculate on our land holding unless we take an audit. A lot of our land was acquired by the government decades ago, but it was returned to us completely encroached.''

He told me that many builders had approached the trust, offering to rehabilitate slum dwellers and redevelop the land. In the early 20th century, the Cama family of Mumbai Samachar owned 1/3rd of the land in Chembur.

In the early part of the 19th century, Ardeshir Hormusji Wadia was given the lease for Kurla, which comprised the six villages of Mohili, Kole Kalyan, Marol, Sahar, Asalphe and Parjapur, for a yearly rent of Rs 3,587.

In 2018, I met Muncherji at the K. R. Cama Oriential Institute in Mumbai, where he was a trustee. The library, founded in 1916, has a treasure trove of ancient Avesta, Pahlavi and Persian literature and manuscripts including books on Islam and the Koran. I was pleasantly surprised when Muncherji readily agreed to show me a rare manuscript, which also happened to be the library's most precious treasure-- a 7th century AD Arabic



manuscript called ``Ahd-Namaha'' or what is called ``Covenants of faith'' or charters granted by the Prophet Mohammad and his son-in-law Imam Ali.

In 2004, my front-page report in TOI about the sale of the Cama family bungalow, Cosy Corner, off Nepean Sea Road to a builder for Rs 108 crore, upset the Camas (So I was told). The builder was one of the tragic victims of the 26/11, 2008 Mumbai terror attack.

MASOOR PAV TRUSTEES MISSTREATED THE ARISTOCRAT MUNCHERJI CAMA

All the obsequies regarding late BPP Trustee Muncherji Cama stress only one thing that Muncherji Cama was the last of the Sethias of yore to have adorned the BPP Boardroom. In 2008 in the first General elections under Adult Franchise, the first Board comprised Dinshaw Mehta, Rustom Tirandaz, the Three Mistry's-Arnavaz, Jimmy and Khojeste, Yazdi Desai and the only AFP member Noshir Dadrawala. Dinshaw Mehta was elected Chairman who in turn nominated Rustom Tirandaz as Dy. Chairman.

In 2009, Rustom unfortunately died in a pool heart attack and Armaity Tirandaz supported by Dinshaw Mehta was elected in his place defeating the Godrej Architect Maneck Engineer sponsored by Kersi Randeria and Arnavaz Mistry.

In 2011, Yazdi Desai and Khojeste Mistry succeeded in hounding out the only Trustee from the Reformist Camp, Noshir Dadrawala and Muncherji Cama was elected in his vacancy supported by both Dinshaw Mehta and Kersi Randeria defeating Yazdi Desai's wife Anahita Desai supported by Yazdi Desai and the three Mistry's. But both Yazdi Desai and Anahita Desai did not forget this loss and were determined to extract revenge for the loss. Despite Yazdi and Anahita taking lakhs of rupees from Dinshaw Mehta to get a favorable Order from the High Court against the very same Kersi Randeria, Yazdi and Anahita managed to frame Dinshaw Mehta in a false misappropriation case in November 2013 which led to Charity Commissioner freezing all property assets.

This led to the Board getting divided into two camps-Dinshaw Mehta, Armaity Tirandaz and Munchi Cama on one side and Yazdi Desai and the three Mistrys on the other and with their majority started taking all decisions without any reference or notice to the others.

Munchi Cama was getting frustrated at the number of applicants coming every week and in spite of having over 100 vacant flats in Trustees possession they were unable to help them. In disgust ultimately in April 2015 Munchi Cama submitted his resignation to the Board of Trustees which was not in accordance with the Scheme of Elections and as CHAIRMAN Dinshaw Mehta refused to accept the same. But Yazdi Desai taking advantage of his Majority filed his resignation with Change Report before the Charity Commissioner and refused to allow him to attend BPP office till the Charity Commissioner gave his findings on the Change Report.

Thus the Masoor Pav Trustees -Yazdi Desai, Khojeste Mistry and Arnavaz Mistry were able to block the entry of the last of the Sethia Trustee Munchi Cama for at least more than three years. The hearing of the Change Report went on and on with Anahita Desai coming with her bodyguard Kayresh Patel at every hearing and delaying the proceedings as much as she could.

The bodyguard later was rewarded by Yazdi and Anahita Desai with a large flat in Dadar Parsi Colony though he had a vacant flat of his late father Cyrus Patel in Godrej Baug C-10 which is now reserved by Yazdi Desai and Anahita Desai for the brother who is settled in USA and married to a Muslim. Due to their influence this flat is not even shown as an unoccupied flat in the BPP records. Ultimately in March 2018 the Change Report was rejected by the Charity Commissioner as being illegal and not in consonance with the terms of the Scheme of Elections and Munchi Cama's right as a Trustee of BPP was restored but he could attend only one Board meeting as his seven year term expired soon thereafter. Thus the husband and wife team of the Desai's did extract their revenge against Munchi Cama who was deprived of almost half his term as a Trustee by the cunning Yazdi and Anahita Desai.






"Dear Friends,

Doctor on Call

Are we falling short of the sugar to make the milk sweet, even king Jadhav Rana of Sanjanfrom the 8th century would not deny this in the present circumstances considering the declining population of the Parsi community.

Speaking of India itself, infertility affects around 10-15% of married Indian couples. As of 2019, it has been estimated that there are only 100,000 to 200,000 Zoroastrians worldwide, with around 60,000 Parsis in India. The reasons for the decline may be attributed to- late marriages, marriages outside the community, separation, divorces and fertility decline as per the study conducted by the National Commission for Minorities (NCM), The Parzor Foundation and Tata Institute of Social Science (TISS). So why is infertility a concern for us? For this, we need to know what infertility is, what the causes for infertility are and what are the treatment options available for it.

So firstly, what basically is infertility? Infertility is the Inability to conceive after two years of unprotected sex. Well this is what the standard definition says but if you ask me the definition changes with age, which means the two-year duration may be applicable to someone who is in their twenties however the same would not be applicable to someone in their late thirty's and forty's. Infertility in 30 % of the cases may be due to the female factors, in 30 % of the cases it may be due to the male factors, in about 10%-20 % of the cases the cause may be attributed to both the partners and in the remaining 20%-30% the cause is unknown- which we generally term as unexplained infertility, which means it affects both men and women equally and both bear the equal brunt of this condition. The prerequisites for conception are- normal ovaries and ovulation, open and functional fallopian tubes, structurally normal uterus, normal hormone status of the female and normal semen parameters in male. A defect at any of the above levels may cause a difficulty in conceiving.

It is important that women are aware of the age-related decline in fertility rates. That means a women is born with all the eggs she is going to have which decrease to 23 % at puberty, 12 % at the age of 30 and only 4 % at 40 years which means that 7% of women are infertile before the age of 30 years, 11% of them are infertile by the age of 35 years and almost 87% are infertile by the age of 45 years.

The causes of infertility pertaining to the ovary may be either due to polycystic ovarian syndrome (ovulation defects) which forms one side of the spectrum and is a common condition encountered in the present-day scenario and premature ovarian insufficiency forming the other end of the spectrum where there is decreased number of eggs. The tubes may be damaged mainly due to infections and due to certain disorders like endometriosis. The structure of the uterus may be disturbed due to fibroids, adenomyosis, polyps and other structural defects. The hormonal disturbances commonly linked to infertility are the thyroid and prolactin related disorders. The investigations commonly carried out to find out the cause of infertility are-female hormone profile, blood tests to check for number of eggs the ovary harbors called ovarian reserve tests, ultrasound examination, x-ray dye tests to check whether the fallopian tubes are open and semen analysis of the husband to find out sperm counts, motility and the structure.

Fertility treatments have seen dramatic changes over the years from inducing ovulation by medicines and hormone injections to intrauterine inseminations to IVF and now ICSI (intracytoplasmic sperm injection).

Quoting the latest article published in Times of India on 14th June titled "As Jiyo Parsi scheme delivers, community sees record births", Jiyo Parsi has been helping with the fertility issues in the community, with the new Doctor on Call program, anyone can seek help sitting at home and get their queries sorted by the specialists. With doctors covering a short discussion of topics related to fertility and pregnancy.





A) Given below are two extracts which will help us understand the importance, splendour and repetitiveness of these beautiful prayers.


