

# BPP WINS EVICTION SUIT AGAINST HINDUSTAN PETROLEUM CORPORATION LTD. PETROL PUMP AT KHAREGHAT COLONY

As the community is aware, the land on which the Petrol Pump stands next to Aderbad building at Khareghat Colony, Hughes Road was originally leased to R.S.Vatcha and Co. by Trustees of BPP from 1-1-1962 for a period of 30 years at a measly lease rent of a few thousand.

The land bearing C. S. No. 1/434 of Malabar Hill Division admeasuring 971.27 sq. yds. was taken over by Caltex (India) Ltd. and thereafter by virtue of Caltex Acquisition Act all the assets, shares, rights, liabilities, etc vested in HPCL.

The Lease of R.S.Vatcha came to an end on 31-12-1991 and in spite of BPP refusing to renew the Lease in favor of HPCL, they exercised their Statutory Option for a further period of 30 years with effect from 1-1-1992.

BPP refused to accept the lease rent but negotiations for further renewal on long term lease and/or purchase of site went on for a long time without any payment of lease rent from 1-1-1992 onwards. Ultimately Eviction Suit No. 73/97 was filed in 2000. HPCL deliberately kept on delaying the matter on ground of negotiation for settlement and ULTIMATELY JUDGMENT WAS DELIVERED IN FAVOR OF THE TRUSTEES THIS WEEK.

HPCL has sought a meeting to settle the matter and will also most likely go in appeal to the Division Bench of the Small Causes Court to prolong the litigation. Since the second Statutory Option of further 30 years has also expired on 31-12-2021, HPCL will have to pay market rent by way of mesne profit if it wants to file appeal which would be in the region of a few lakhs every month. Further lease rent arrears from 1-1-1992 to 31-12-2021 will also have to be paid to BPP.



In view of the grave financial crisis of BPP at present this is a God sent gift to BPP. The land admeasuring 8741 sq.ft. would be worth over Rs. 30 crores which is the minimum that HPCL should be made to Pay along with Lease Rent arrears from 1-1-1992.

If this land is taken over by BPP for its own development then about 20,000 sq.ft. of buildability is available. Assuming this was to be sold to Parsis only on Ownership basis then a rate of Rs. 50,000/ per sq.ft. would be fair and decent whose total value would be around Rs. 100 crore. Deducting cost of construction and BMC payments of Rs. 10 crore, BPP would still earn around Rs. 90 crore but this will accrue only after a few years.

It is now for the Trustees to decide whether to negotiate with HPCL and try and get an optimum sale price from them or face the rigor of their appeal right upto Supreme Court of India in the hope of earning Rs. 90 crore after a decade or more.

Whilst there will be pros and cons on either option, the newly elected Trustees will have to bite the bullet one way or the other. A high level committee be formed to advise the Trustees on which Option is favorable and then proceed forward, especially as the Trustees will be taking on the Govt. of India upto the Supreme Court and if some new legislation is formulated in the mean time we may lose everything.


## FIRST COVID RAVAAN CONSIGNED TO THE BANAJI DOKHMA AT DOONGERWADI

Pursuant to the vociferous demands of the orthodox sections of our community to avoid cremation of Parsi covid ravaans but to give them our time tested and approved mode of disposal of Parsi/Irani ravaans by Dokhmenashini and the Supreme Court approval of the same with certain guidelines, the Banaji Dokhma which was lying unused for several decades was restored as per guidelines of the Supreme Court at a cost of Rs. 5-6 lakhs, paid as a donation by one of the Trustees, and with the co-operation of the Union and the Khandiyas (pall bearers), the first covid ravaan was consigned on Saturday 18th june 2022 under Dokhmenashini.

We congratulated the bpp for ensuring that henceforth every Parsi/Iirani covid victim is consigned to the Towers of Silence. Surprisingly the so called ultra-orthodox community members and groups like the Parsi Voice, TZML, PIPZ and others have not yet congratulated the new board for this very first non-cremation of a Parsi covid victim.

The lady expired on the 18th of June due to Covid. Her Ravaan was brought to the Doongerwadi in a Covid ambulance and taken straight up to the Banaji Dokhma and placed on the 'Last Salutation Slab.'

Following the prescribed SOPS, the body was handled by four Pall Bearers present in complete PPE kit worn over their Khand Uniform.



The family members were seated in a designated area over fifteen feet away. The two priests that did the Geh Sarna ceremony were distanced over fifteen feet as well.

After the Geh Sarna prayers were over, the four Pall Bearers took the ravaan inside the Banaji Dokhma. After coming out the PPE kits were removed and the same along with the body bag were placed in bins for disposal.

A big thank you to the Doongerwadi managed Mr. Vistaspar Mehta as well as his deputy, Mr. ArzanPatel for their efforts to ensure that the families were treated well and the prescribed SOPs were followed. Thank you to Trustee Viraf Mehta who was also present during this time to ensure everything went smoothly.

1. For the Repairing/Reconstructing of the road adjacent to our Well to avoid internal flooding during the monsoons, as the pathway is in a very dilapidated condition;

2. To construct a Drinking Water Podium for providing fresh drinking water for thirsty travellers.

Diniar Mehta put to use his good offices, and wrote to the Municipal Corporator - Shri Makrand Narwekar – to get this work started. The Community will be delighted to know that the construction work for both projects started on June 21, 2022 (Bahman Mahino, Avan Roj), with an auspicious Muhurat Ceremony (breaking the coconut) which took place at our Bhika Behram Well at around 12.00 noon, at the hands of Municipal Shri Makrand Narwekar in the presence of BMC Officials.

On this occasion Shri Makrand Narwekar -Municipal Corporator "A" Ward, Mr. Diniar Darab Mehta – President of Minority (Parsi) Cell, Mr. Dinshaw R. Mehta - Former President of Bombay Parsi Punchayet, Mr. Hoshi Jal -

Present Trustee of Bombay Parsi Panchayet, Mr. Homiar N. Vakil - Solicitor & Trustee of Bhika Behram Well and Mr. Shahrukh Davar - Trustee of Bhika Behram Well, remained present along with Community Members.

The project is slated to take 2-3 weeks for completion. The beautification and clearing of the adjacent pavements will provide greater convenience and safety for pedestrians, especially Parsi Community members who regularly visit the Holy Bhika Behram Well.

# SOME TYPICAL PARSITERMS

Parsis landed in India about 1200 years ago. The exact date of landing differs amongst scholars but that is not important. After the sugar and spice, and all that's nice sort of episodes, we were allowed to stay in the kingdom of Sanjan, but with a rider, rather four riders - one of which was, we will learn to speak in the Indian language only. It is safe to conclude that the language meant was Gujarati. At first, the 'Parsis' as the locals called us, must have communicated in 'Farsi' with a few Gujarati words. With the passage of time Gujarati took over and a smattering of Farsi was fused into it. A lilt came into our Gujarati, some harsher inflexions were softened. Even now we use some Persian words without even realizing that they are of the Persian origin. Our own literature developed in what is today called the Parsi Gujarati. Today we speak 'Parsi Gujarati' with a smattering of English in it. It is evolving, it is a living language. Unfortunately with the passage of time some very fruity words, phrases and ditties are now being replaced by more sophisticated terms. Here are some Parsi terms which are no longer or rarely heard but were common about half a century ago...

'Bucho' or 'buchi' for a small boy or a girl. Eg: "Kem bucha, su karech? Lesson kar nahi-to Mehtaji ni eskol ma javu parse. Aaye buchi kon che?" Mehtaji's school was a sort of school where children were sent to learn basic Gujarati and Arithmetic.

The word 'dukhti' was also used for a girl which was probably of Persian origin meaning girl or daughter. Similarly 'dukhto' became the masculine version for a boy or son, came into our Gujarati.

'Mai ghee' or 'Dudh pau' meant sissy or a mamma's boy.

'Ponio' was not a very manly person, a softy. 'Pona aath' (7:45) meant being slow on the uptake.

'Trim taraak' meant well dressed; 'Jeebharu' means blessed. Eg. Mara jeebharu Jamshedjee to trim-taraak thai ne dur ravivare ghora dorava (horse races) jaaye!

'Gharara jevo' or 'Gharasia jevo' is tall and handsome. This term probably has its roots in reference with the Grenadiers of the British army.

'Choi Jevo lagech' – The term 'choi' was used for the local darjee or tailor. Actually the term denoted a man wearing tight, ill-fitting trousers with very narrow bottoms.

An 'Ichchamji' is a man who overdresses gaudily and shows off. Eg: Mare-re! Ichchamji jevo taiyar thaich!

'Kuchi' is a door-key and 'Pijan patlo' means being repetitive. Eg: Ek-no-ek Pijan-patlo na kar! (Don't keep repeating the same thing over and over again!)

'Potanoj kak-ko kharo' indicates only whatever he/she says is right, no-one else.

'Houson-jhouson' is the Hoi polloi or not very welcoming guests or people in big numbers. Probably a corrupt form of the English term, 'Hobson-Jobson'.

'Natru' is a divorcee planning to remarry, commented upon as, "Mui natru karva challi!"

'Pa. Cho.' (Gujarati letters for a. p. and ch.)

– Apoplexy. The greedy person's cause of death will be apoplexy – "maran nu kaaran a.p.cho." Similarly there was also a phrase

– "Maran-nu kaaran dhakhara" for someone who had lots of pretentions.

"Chaas ma muro dovio" means committed a faux pas. And "Chekapie / capapie" means crazy – probably a corruption of the French 'cap à pied' meaning from head to foot. Almost similar to "Pavli kum."

"Ghela ghanchi-nu kutumb" a family of idiots—sort of like the Hillbillies.

'Velaat' originally meant England. The term came in existence when the British posted in India would be returning to their homeland. They would be heard saying, "I'm going back to old Blighty!" Bligthy was a term lovingly used for England. When Indians heard this, especially their household staff, this term was corrupted to bilayat, vilayat and velaat.

Wearing a topi was a must at all times of the day. Those who did not wear it at night were told, "Topi nahi peher se to raatna saitaan avi-ne matha per taplo mari jase." If you don't wear your prayer cap at night the devil will come and give you a whack on the head.

Drinking toddy directly from the pitcher was called 'Taans Marvi', which was supposed to be the manly way of drinking toddy – only 'dudh-paos' sipped it from the glass. It was frowned upon by the countryside veterans!

'Chhato-pani' meant time for drinking. "Chhato-pani karve chalo!" meant the time for libation. Come let's have a drink!

"Parvaarya ke?" – This term was often heard across the windows normally by noon time. Eg: "Kem Tehmina, parvaryake?" Or, are you done with your chores?

If there was a new-born child at home one could hear lullabies being sung in Parsi Gujarati such as "Ah ha mari Dolly tu, kavi mari dolly tu, Aapu tu-ne badhdha jee, raku pet-ma chapi; Dolly mari motti thai, motti thai nasal-e jai..." etc. There were songs and ditties for every occasion. There was yet another ditty recited by an old aunt or granny while children played hide and seek where the seeker's eyes were held shut by the woman and others would hide. The lady would sing, "Naso-re goso-re, tu to maro doso re, doso gayo vaari, tya thi pidhi taari, taari pidhi garye (Pitcher), Doso gayo darye, Darye, darye laga chor...... Pillu chhut-tu?" The last line meant, now the chick is free. There was yet another one which was of a slightly violent nature. It went, "Vaat karo vaat, vaniya hata saat, ek-e maari laat, bijo gayo Velaat, tija-e maari chari, chotho gayo mari. Baaki rehya tran, so and so sathe pun, pun-hoi to pun, nahi-to saw rupiya dund!" And so on there are so many such fun ditties. These were in our own lingo and reflected our culture. Unfortunately, these days there is no one and no time to sit by the side of our tots and tell these gems. Both parents work, even the grannies who were once the repositories of our lore have become too sophisticated. They must 'de-sophisticate' themselves sometimes and tell the young ones of the good old days in the sweet tongue that is rarely heard nowadays. Save our Parsi Bhasha which is becoming more and more 'Gujaratindi' or 'Gujaringlish'!
